It's July already. Halfway through the year and if you are anything like me you are wondering how you



might be able to have a break from all the craziness of the last 15 months. For some those wonderings will lead to the possibility of a journey. Probably not a flight although some might be able to go abroad, but maybe a car, train or bus journey to somewhere quite possibly beautiful where you find yourself in awe of the created world around you.

The thing about these journeys is that you will hopefully know where you are going, and if you are driving, you will hopefully know the way. You cannot plan for things that could hold you up like traffic jams or that might cause you to divert like roadworks, but you will have a good idea of each leg of the journey before you set off. Even before you could ask your phone to navigate for you, we had the AA map of Great Britain to help us plan out our route. That's what we kind of expect life to be like in the 21st century western world. We want to know where this relationship will lead, what progression this job offers, we set plans for where we want to be in 5, 10 or 20 years time. We plan when we will have children, and even move houses in order to control the schools those kids will go to.

The problem for us is that when we were called to follow Jesus, we embarked on а iournev but we didn't actually know the destination. Although we believe it will ultimately be heaven we do not have the luxury of knowing how like Jesus we will be in 10 years time, or how strong our faith will be after the life events in the next 5 years, and we definitely don't know the route our lives will be taking. Accepting that call, giving our lives to Jesus, saying we would follow him was taking the first step on that journey, but for many they have yet to take a second step because its scary, unknown. We can't see the route before us, we are unsure of the problems that lie ahead and so we have stopped and waited, hoping that Jesus will have a "Home Alone" moment, realise he's forgotten the kids and come back for us. But Jesus said "Follow me" and that suggests he will be on the move and we are to keep our eyes on him so we can ... well ... follow.

I read recently that discipleship is a "purposeful pursuit of relationship with God" and this really sorts the sheep from the goats, the keen from the church goer, the Jesus Follower from the pew filler. The Jesus follower determines that whatever happens, whatever unexpected turn or bump we encounter in the road they will seek Jesus. The mark of a dedicated disciple in Jesus' day was they were covered in the dust kicked up by the Rabbi's feet. Are we following so closely we are dusty or is our dust from sitting still too long?

This summer I hope that your physical journeys go smoothly and in the direction you intend, but more importantly I pray that your spiritual journey goes purposefully and faithfully. That you may be covered in the dust from Jesus' feet, grow in the likeness of Christ and follow on the path set by God

Dear Friends and Family,

Thank you for your support and prayers. We have updated our blog with recent news from our family and Nepal. (Google search BMS Doulas family) but here are a few highlights.....

Helen recovered well from her surgery and after medical clearance at the start of May we flew to South Africa.



After several weeks of fostering, we are thrilled to announce that Qiniso ( which means Truthful in Zulu ) Judah joined our family. He is such an amazing, lively, fun filled little boy with the most beautiful eyes, gorgeous smile and infectious giggle! We praise God for his settling so well into our family. He loves his big brother and sisters and tells anyone who will listen

that "me is now a Dug-u-lus"! God has been in every detail of the journey, with so many amazing answered prayers and provision along the way, we thank Him for His goodness and faithfulness. We have several administrative tasks to complete before we can apply for a British passport for him, so will need to stay in S.Africa for another month or so.

On Friday the children complete their school year - which has been entirely online! Caleb's AS exams were cancelled at the very last minute as Nepal entered lockdown. Unlike UK schools, they did not have further assessments set in the summer and so will receive their grades based mainly on the mock exams from before Easter. Caleb has already stated the A'Level course and is looking forward to a break over the summer.

Angus has been working remotely from S.Africa - which is 1 hour closer to the Nepali time zone and so makes things easier for meetings. It is tricky juggling 3 online schoolers, plus his online working as ever - but now with a lively toddler in the midst! He is starting to undertake more of the responsibilities for his new INF role.

Currently the Nepali border is closed due to the high levels of covid. But we are praying that this situation improves allowing us to return once we have Qiniso's passport.

#### Please pray for;

INF and HDCS mission hospitals - for resources, strength and protection as they serve. That they might shine as beacons of hope in the midst of fear and sadness

INF and other Christian organisations and churches as they reach out to those struggling with the impact of lockdown, particularly amongst the poorest.

INF's general agreement to be signed – enabling visa's to be issued (including Angus')

For the Nepali Church to grow in depth, hope and maturity as the walk through this dark valley and be able to share that with others.

For Angus as he undertakes more of his new role at INF remotely.

For us as a family as we adjust to life with our new addition. That Qiniso would feel safe, loved and secure with us, despite the huge transition done and another ahead when we return to Nepal.

For Nepal as they face this huge covid surge, for the government to resolve political dispute and work with unity and wisdom.

For God's hand in our paperwork processing for the adoption, and passport application.

For guidance regarding when and how we return to Nepal.

Thank you for your partnership with us. Your prayers and support are essential and much valued.

As situations change on an almost daily basis we can only make tentative plans...




Hopefully we will be able to hold our Prayer meeting on Thursday 29th July face to face as well as on Zoom

#### **Book Review**



Red Letter Christianity: Living the words of Jesus no matter the cost.

If you tuned into the Baptist Assembly United Worship service on 16th May you will have heard Shane Claibourne who was invited to be their keynote speaker.


Shane worked with Mother Teresa in Calcutta and heads up "Red Letter Christians" a movement of people who are committed to living as if Jesus meant the things He said, what a radical idea. ( radical sounds non Christian but the definition of radical is "going to the fundamental root of an issue ")

To read this book is to become the third person as they just sit and chat about issues in this world and share their often differing views. They talk about relevant and crucial issues that face followers of Jesus today and ask how seriously do we take His words? And do we need to understand what that means for our lives not just on a Sunday but the other 6 days of the week, when on Monday the weekend seems miles away and the mountains in-between seem unsurmountable. How do we live an authentic life ( MonSat) when the pressures to conform to this world we live in surround us?

In this book Shane teams up with Tony to explore the issues and questions we all face, how do we live the words of Jesus no matter what the cost?

One thing is for sure striving and working at it will just end in failure it is only when we enter into a daily relationship with Jesus, and understand just what He meant when he said "come to me learn from me the unforced rhythms of grace "(Matthew 11: 28) that things become clearer, and we realise the only ability Jesus requires of us is "availability"

You may not agree with all or any the views expressed in this book, but engaging with the issues will make you question what you believe and help you clarify why you hold the views you do.





Just a quick update....come and visit the site ...

Work started earlier this year on the construction of the Eternal Wall of Answered Prayer, It will be a huge Christian landmark and will sit in the heart of the UK, work is due to be completed by the end of 2022.

It is about how one person's answered prayer can become another person's hope. Answered prayer is a springboard for faith with each story reflecting a beautiful aspect of God's intention towards us. We know it will make hope visible to our country. Each brick will recount a personal, specific way in which God has answered a prayer for people both now and in the past, offering a vast amount of experiences all explaining how God has come through for individuals in the midst of life's storms.

The gigantic monument of hope will host a million accounts of answered prayer, making it the largest database of hope stories in the world and it will be located on a 10 acre Greenbelt site near Coleshill. The completed wall will be 51 meters high and will be visible up to 6 miles away it is expected to be seen by half a million vehicles on the nearby M6 and M42 each week.

The role gives an opportunity to engage with and support people by providing practical and holistic support for people struggling with debt, as well as offering them the chance to hear the Gospel.


As a partnership appointment, following church interview, the successful candidate will be recommended to CAP for follow-up interview and appointment.




#### **Praise and Prayer**

### A Lifelong Friendship Forged at MCBC.

Back in the 1930's/1940's Sundays were a little different from what they are today. We started off with Sunday School at 10am and joined the main service at 10.45am, After about half an hour the Sunday School scholars left for home. At 2pm the Sunday School re-opened until about 3pm. At 6pm the evening service was held and some of the younger people also attended. As we got into our teens we often met after church and



moved on to one of our friends homes for a natter and some supper. We took it in turns with the consent of our parents.

MCBC formed the YPF – Young Peoples Fellowship and we used to meet on a Monday evening when we were about 15 years old.

Time marched on and many of us were baptised as we approached the age of 18 as the lads realised they would be called up for 2 years National Service away from home.

Within our group was Trevor Carpenter who lived with his family in Graham Street and a young lady Barbara Benfell who lived with her family in Shanklin Drive. They fell in love and eventually married. Trevor C decided to make a career in the Royal Air Force and trained as a Navigator in air crew. They travelled all over the world but kept in touch with some of the old YPF. When Trevor retired from the RAF his last posting had been at Manby in Lincolnshire so they bought a house there and settled in.

Sadly Trevor passed away on 11<sup>th</sup> June 2021 after a short but painful illness. His funeral took place on 30<sup>th</sup> June 2021 at Alford in Lincolnshire.

I don't expect there are many people at MCBC now who will remember them but I give thanks for the influence MCBC had upon our lives.




