

The Message bus is a Together for Change initiative who obtained funding through the Warwickshire Churches team and King Henry 8Th trust to give a grant to the Message Trust to enable them to commission a Message bus for the young people of Warwick and the surrounding areas.

After 4 years of planning...the bus has now been built the driver recruited and the project has gone live !!!! See saints facebook page for job vacancies

The bus has been stripped to make way for the installation of state of the art technologies including; Xboxes, karaoke machines, plasma screens, iPads and also a kitchen that will serve hot food. There will also be an outdoor space with seating, outdoor plasma screens, a parasol and food hatch. The bus will be based in Warwick and used to support young people in that area, but it can also be hired out across the diocese when it is free, with the main objective being to launch new Christian youth groups and support existing youth groups and schools work.



The message trust say "When they step on board, young people will find a safe place to go as well as somewhere packed full of stuff to do with their mates. Each bus is different but they'll find things like games consoles, nail bars, climbing walls, slides, gaming PCs and much more."

"But the buses are about more than just this. Every young person also gets to hear about how loved they are by Jesus and have a chance to explore this for themselves with our teams. As we park up and spend time in communities we see lives transformed."

PETE GREIG GOD ON MUTE ENGAGING THE SILENCE OF UNANSWERED PRAYER

Book review

God on mute—engaging the silence of unanswered prayer

Pete Greig is the bewildered founder of the 24-7 Prayer movement which has reached more than half the nations on earth, and Senior Pastor of Emmaus Rd, a church with

congregations in Surrey and Hampshire.

24/7 prayer(24-7 Prayer International | About 24-7 Prayer) began by accident in 1999 when a simple student led prayer vigil in a warehouse on the south coast of England went viral. A poem scribbled on the prayer room wall suddenly took on a life of its own. Within weeks the vision had reached 100,000 underground churches in China, and 400,000 young people in Washington DC.

Today that first prayer room has touched more than two million people in more than 10,000 prayer rooms in most denominations and more than half the nations on earth. Today they are still praying non-stop, night-and-day, from the slums of Delhi to a brewery in Missouri ...oh, and in churches and cathedrals too.

Red Moon Rising is the story of how that movement continues today--and how each of us can be a part of the miracles God is doing through a new generation.

God on Mute: The most powerful theological books are not written from a distant theoretical viewpoint, but from the battlefield. They're authored by a writer who has wrestled intensely with their theme in the gritty, raw realities of this life. That is precisely why Pete Greig's book on unanswered prayer is so very powerful and profound. For anyone wondering why God seems absent and why heaven seems silent, God on Mute has some extremely helpful, and healing, things to say. This book has already impacted many thousands, and I know it will impact you. --Matt Redman, Worship Leader



Prayer Tool: How To Prayer Walk

What?

Prayer walking is stepping out and praying for your community as you walk. This prayer tool will help you to get started.

Why?

"There is not a square inch in the whole domain of our human existence over which Christ, who is Sovereign over all, does not cry, 'Mine!'" Abraham Kuyper Bible Reference:

"I am giving you every square inch of the land you set your foot on." Joshua 1:3

A quick introduction to Prayer Walking

One of the most effective forms of spiritual warfare is prayer-walking. Inspired by God's promise to Joshua, we can walk the victory of Jesus into every part of our neighbourhoods, cities and nations.

In faith we walk, believing that as the soles of our feet hit the ground, we are appropriating the work of Jesus over the principalities and powers influencing the atmosphere and shaping the narratives of our city.

Each step we take in Jesus' name, we weaken something of the enemy's grip in the Heavenly realms and subvert the systems of evil and injustice.

Prayer walking thrusts us out of our church buildings, forcing us to resist the temptation to stay inward-focused, stirring us to keep the mission front and centre. It engages all our senses, rousing us to cry out to God - as we walk with defiant hope into every crack and crevice of our cities.

While we walk in victory, and therefore pray in victory, let us remember the way that victory was won – sacrificial, self-emptying, love.

Prayer Tool: How to Prayer Walk

As we prayer-walk, let's not get so consumed with the forces of darkness and our own adrenaline rush of triumphalism that we get our eyes off Jesus. Let us kneel in our streets in a posture of humility, repentance and unity, and let us declare that Jesus' sacrifice is more than enough for the redemption of all peoples and places.

Do it: How to Prayer Walk - This uses **WALK** as an acronym, and contains 4 simple steps:

W - Worship

As you set off walking begin with your eyes on Jesus. Say the name of Jesus; recite a Psalm; hum a worship song; speak quietly in tongues – basically anything that helps declare the Lordship of Jesus over the streets you walk on.

A - Ask

Flowing from your worship begin petitioning God for His Spirit to fall on the streets you walk on, the homes, businesses, schools and other churches you walk past. Begin to get specific and pray for people and situations, the 'people of peace' you know God has brought you into contact with, who are opening up doors of opportunity for the gospel within your community.

L - Listen

As you worship and pray, leave space to listen to what God might want to say to you - then pray that back. Often God may give you promises from scripture or prophetic words and pictures; listen for promises and literally walk these promises all over your community.

If you are prayer-walking in twos, listen to one another's prayers and you will find yourself sparking off one another's words and thoughts.

K - Know your Land

Get (and keep) yourself informed around the area you are prayer-walking; research some of its history; some of its ongoing problems; so you can pray for breakthrough.

Get to know some of the current situations that require persevering prayer and also celebrate the particular graces that rest on the area, asking God to make your area a blessing beyond I

Mary Martin 21st Oct 1936 – 5th August 2021

Mary was an active member of Manor Court Church for many years and maintained a strong Christian faith throughout her life.

She fell at home on 31st July and was admitted to George Eliot Hospital. She had successful hip surgery on 2nd August, however she had a sudden heart attack on the ward and died there on 5th August.

Mary's husband Graham was a partner at Red Roofs Surgery, Nuneaton from 1973 but sadly he died following a fall off his bicycle in 2014.

Graham and Mary met on the mission field in Ethiopia. They married and worked there for around 3years but came home to the UK to have their first baby Andrew, who sadly was born with physical and mental disabilities. They did not return to Ethiopia but Graham trained for working in General Practice.

They adopted their daughter Michelle as a baby in 1979.

Mary and Graham moved to Wolvey after Graham retired and continued to attend Manor Court. After Graham's death Mary continued to live in Wolvey but found driving, particularly at night, difficult and finally gave up driving. She then began to attend Wolvey C of E church but kept her membership at Manor Court.

Mary was a faithful member of Tuesday Fellowship for many years and also supported the work of our Prospects Group for those with learning disabilities.

She was a wonderful caring Christian lady who will be missed by her family and all who knew her.





there is no Crèche at present and in the short term the young people are going straight through to their groups and staying there for the full service to reduce unnecessary mixing.


