Sometimes when I come to write something for the magazine I have to sit, think hard and squeeze an idea out of my head and into the shape of a short article. At



other times I simply sit down and share where God has brought me to in that moment, and this is definitely one of those latter moments.

There's been a lot going on hasn't there! I guess if you were sit and list all the things that you've been dealing with, worrying about, planning for, or simply having happen around you every day, the list could be quite extensive. Whether it is health worries, work concerns, home life issues, hopes for the future or hang ups from the past, our brains are often full of stuff, and we get to bed at night with our minds still racing: did I do that right, I mustn't forget to do this in the morning, I hope so-and-so's going to be alright.

Add to all that the fact that the world seems to be spinning ever faster with the nights drawing in and Christmas adverts on TV already and we shouldn't be surprised if we find ourselves at times just wanting to stop the world and get off, at least for a while.

Everyone has this to some degree, but recently the big thing in society has been mindfulness. This is a practice of stilling the mind and being aware of your body and mind in that single moment, and to then focus our thoughts onto something that brings us joy or energy. It has become a very popular practice with people all over taking a few moments to be still, to take a breath, and focus on something good.

in fact mindfulness has become so popular, large companies are providing sessions for their employees (to help with productivity of course), mental health agencies are providing courses for those on no or low incomes, and if you search the internet you can spend a fortune on various mindfulness courses tailored just to suit your needs.

The thing is when mindfulness in the 21st century says be still, psalm 46 from around 3000 years ago says: *Be still, and know that I am God*.

When mindfulness says stop and think of something good, Paul wrote in Philippians 4 almost 2000 years ago: whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable—if anything is excellent or praiseworthy—think about such things.

Essentially as we have been looking at "Practicing the presence of God" Christian mindfulness is one such technique. As the leaves are turning and things head unstoppably toward Winter these next months, why not take a moment to be still and practice the presence of God, knowing God is there with you. Why not just sit and look at a tree, or even one leaf and observe the beauty of that small part of God's creation and thank God for what you see. And then take captive every thought (2 Corinth 10:5) and choose to think of the true, the noble, the right and the pure, the lovely and the admirable. In doing so you will find that God's world spins far slower, and is a place you are more likely to want to stay.

CAP Debt Centre Manager



The Vine Christian Bookshop The Borough Hinckley


