8 Week Interactive Steps to Employment Course Starts Thursday 3rd February 10.30am at MCBC

We are very pleased to be able to announce the Launch of a new ministry in MCBC. Terry Salter after serving the CAP debt centre for 10 years retired in December and is now launching the new CAP Job Club.

Terry will be heading up the project with support from Isaac and Joy Olinipekun.

Unemployment plays a huge part in UK poverty, with upwards of one million people out of work. As rejection letters pile up, many people are left feeling hopeless.

The CAP Job club will offer help and support to the unemployed in our community, through the eight-week interactive Steps to Employment Course, covering topics such as identifying strengths, CV writing, and interview techniques course, community, and one-to-one coaching sessions.

The course has been designed to be an easy and effective way to practically equip club members, in a supportive environment that boosts confidence and morale. It will help jobseekers gain the tools, skills and confidence to step back into employment, and the combined practical and emotional support is why the Department of Work and Pensions highly recommends this service.




January Prayer meetings

In The presence of Jesus

A 40 day guide to the intimacy with God you have always wanted

Paul Bane is the founder of Mindful Christianity, an online community helping people rediscover the lost contemplative and meditative tradition of practicing the presence of Jesus in our daily lives.

We are not talking about discovering a new technique a new practice but rediscovering the art of abiding (its definition is "to be and remain united with Jesus, one with Him in heart, mind, and will, and to remain steadfast, unwavering in that relationship.")

On the night that Jesus was arrested he gave His last important message to His followers, I am the vine, you are the branches *abide* in me....without me you can do nothing (John 15)

This book offers guidance on how to find peace and inner contentment in the stress, noise and activity of modern life, how to learn to quiet your mind and focus attention on the grace and love that is only available in God's presence.

Learning to practice the awareness of God, to enter the presence of the Great "I Am " to sit in stillness with Jesus each day, is the only real way to find peace in the world. It is truly where God transforms us.

We do not need to learn or study anything more about God, we don't need more head knowledge, what we need is a deeper connection. The distance from the head to the heart is only 18 inches but it can also be the longest journey we ever undertake.

So if you are feeling burned out, weary and feeling that God seems far away, if you feel thirsty yearning for a real touch of God in your life, then this book is for you.

Don't have enough time ?....It is a 40 day journey but each days reading and practice are designed to take just 10 –15 minutes, what is that ?the time it takes to drink a tea or coffee ? Lets commit to set aside time to refresh ourselves this January.
