

people were going through because of Covid, personal illness or loss of loved ones. Sometimes following difficult news within my own family. But as I sit to write this, the country of Ukraine and the violent invasion by the undemocratic and frankly corrupt Russian regime looms large in our headlines. Already people are divided over whether we should set tougher sanctions, send troops, and if we should accept Ukrainian refugees as they flee the carnage of war in their own country.

It does seem that as the last of those who can remember the sheer horror of the second world war die, the foolishness and greed of humanity chooses to ignore the lessons learned from history. And in all this we can be forgiven for feeling and thinking that we are insignificantly small unwanted parts in the large and complex machine of world politics, but that is not true. Despite how daunting the efforts and bizarre thought processes of even the most deranged despot may be, we know a God who is greater than anything manmade. In Matthew 19:26 Jesus tells his disciples:

"With man this is impossible, but with God all things are possible."

I am a control freak. I try to let go of the need to control things, and over time the urge is diminished, but like any recovering addict I have to recognise what my true nature is. So it is that despite the fact that it is often spoken as a somewhat trite cliché, the statement: "I may not know what tomorrow holds, but I know who holds tomorrow" has become a great way of realigning my approach to the uncertainty of things beyond my control.

You are not insignificant. You are not too small or unwanted. You are deeply loved by the creator of the universe, who doesn't want to do anything without involving us. God's kingdom is not a human democracy but a theocracy where its citizens are listened to, their prayers heard, and when it right to do so, they are acted upon. But when only a few pray, and most of the citizens abstain, God waits until it is important enough to us.

God is longing to hear your voice, wants to know your desires, and is waiting to act. Are we longing to spend time with God? Are we wanting to share the desires of our heart with God? Are we willing to bring our needs and fears before God, to pray and invest our time and emotions in that prayer and trust in the one who holds who holds tomorrow to act?

# Prayer Walking on Sunday mornings at MCBC: will you be part of the Team?

We have been sending out 2 people to prayer walk in the area of Abbey Green during our morning services for several years.

During the Covid pandemic when we did not have a face to face service prayer walking continued and on some Sundays we were able to send out two teams of two people.

Since we have been able to start back to worship face to face, we have been struggling to have enough volunteers to fill all the jobs needed to enable us to run our morning services. As a result we have not had enough people to go out prayer walking and this ministry has not happened for the past few months.

We held a meeting last Sunday after the service to discuss this ministry and to see if we had enough people to restart.

Rosemary, Isaac, Pam, Ash and Charlotte who attended, all felt that prayer walking is important and were happy to volunteer to be part of a new rota.

We feel that 5 is too few a number to be able to restart. 8 people could be considered as the minimum needed, which would mean each team of 2 prayer walking once a month. If we had 16 volunteers it would be every 2 months.

Please pray and think about whether God would want you to be involved in this work. If you are interested, please let Roger know.

We will have prayer walking as an agenda item at our next church meeting on the 17 March.






Hello everyone,

# Guidance Notes from the World vision child sponsorship team

We know sometimes it's hard to think of what to write. you can start with something like:

Describe your family and friends: names, what they look like, interests

Share your (or your children's) interests and favourites: colours, animals, school subjects, sports, hobbies

Tell your sponsored child why you're thankful for them and that you are praying for them

Ask them about their family and friends

Ask about their hopes and dreams — what they want to be when they grow up

Ask what they're learning in school,

ask about their favourite games and sports



# MCBC Evening Communion Service on 13<sup>th</sup> March at 6.00pm and then every second Sunday of the month

Following discussion at our January church meeting MCBC and as Covid restrictions are eased we agreed to restart an evening service once a month at 6pm. This will be on the second Sunday of the month and the first service will be on 13 March.

It will be a communion service following a Baptist communion liturgy and will include anointing with oil for healing and blessing for those who request this.

The worship style will be more traditional than the morning style with mainly hymns, and a shorter sermon, to enable more time to be spent on communion. We plan for the service to last around one hour.

The dates of the following services will be 10th April (Palm Sunday) 8th May, 12th June, 10th July, 14th Aug, 11th Sept, 9th Oct and 13th Nov

We will need help from a small "team" to enable these services to happen regularly. We need people to offer to be on "welcome duty", people to work the sound desk and pro-presenter and people to prepare a cup of tea/ coffee after the service if people feel that would be helpful.

If you feel able to volunteer for any of these jobs could you let me know and I will co-ordinate this with Sara in the MCBC office.

We know that there are only a few churches that are now offering an evening service so we have let other local churches know and we would ask if you could "spread the word" about the service and invite others who might like to attend.

With so many prayer needs at home and in the world at present, can I encourage you to make these dates a


priority this month.


