

One year ago, in 2021 our Easter celebration was the first service to be held in church with a live



congregation since the pandemic lockdowns of 2020. As we look at the congregation now we see not only live in person services, but two worship bands, Junior church back in action, prayer walking about to restart, refreshments after the service and recently we celebrated communion by being served the bread and wine minus the plate. It is a most wonderful thing to see the return to what was considered normal, and it is in no small way down to many of you who have taken the plunge and not only returned but volunteered to help.

Thank you so much. This really is faith family in action, doing what we have been talking about with a desire to see people flourish. How great is that!

Of course, we also have to be honest and admit that we (like most churches around the world) are missing at least a third of our regular congregation, and if that includes you, I really do mean "we are missing you". As a community church, we feel the pain of loss when those we have journeyed with for so long choose to leave us.

For some this has been the start of an exciting adventure of starting a new life in a new place,

but for some others it has been more the absence of deciding to return. We do miss you and would love to welcome you back into our midst, to worship together, and catch up over a coffee after.

But having celebrated the return to normal, the question must be asked, where to now? During the pandemic when nothing was possible, many church leaders around the country encouraged embracing the time of lockdown and church closure as the opportunity to bring about change. Many church members around the country however feared change and what might be lost when they already felt they had lost so much. Now we are back, reunited (if not reinvigorated yet), so I believe very much that this is the time to be asking what God wants us to do and where God wants us to go. I still firmly believe that God wants us to become more committed, more vulnerable and more open-hearted followers of Jesus, and that as we focus on our spiritual journeys, seeking to grow in the likeness of Christ, our relationships with the community around us will be closer, the practice of our faith more real and less "religious", and our evangelism will be natural.

I have been training for two terms now in how to be a "Spiritual Companion" (once called "Spiritual Director") to those who truly want to see where God is at work in their lives so that their relationship with Jesus might deepen and their lives be more Christ like. The more I study this, (and see my own "companion" who I have been seeing for some years now) the more I am amazed that so few people seek Spiritual accompaniment, and I would encourage you all to consider setting aside an hour once every 6 weeks or so to start to explore what God is doing in your life.

As we celebrate Easter this month, let it not only be a celebration of Christ rising from the dead, but let it be the start of His church also coming alive into new life in all its fullness.

Notes from the Church Meeting 17th March 2022

Finances: Terry reported it has been a complex year due to the impact of Covid but the figures to the end of the year look very positive. The new budget for 2022/23 reflects savings necessary to take into account inflation and the upcoming energy price increases etc. He advised he and the leadership are very aware of the faithful generosity and kindness of those who give to the church finances.

CIO update : the proposal to create a link to the old charity to enable anything given in the old charities name to be accessed was voted on and agreed unanimously.

Ukraine update: It was agreed that as a church MCBC would register interest as a Refugee friendly church for any refugees that may come to our area without family and friends in the UK. Terry will be co-ordinator and Jonathan and James will be welcomer's there will be further information at a later date

regarding contributions for welcome packs.

Ukraine Drop In centre at MCBC: (Українська крапля в центрі)

Godfrey Hands suggested that we could also open church 5 days a week (possibly afternoons) to enable any local Ukrainian refugees and their children to have a place to come together and meet with fellow countrymen and women over tea and cake and also have access to a computer. Anyone who would like to be involved please see Rosemary & Godfrey Hands. (Terry advised that there is a translation app that can be downloaded onto your phone to help with conversations.)

CAP update: Pam advised that the CAP debt centre is doing well.

Terry advised the CAP job club has been well attended and Scott Watson is helping with IT skills. The next course is due to start 28th April

Prayer Walking

We would still like more people to volunteer for the prayer walking rota. Thank you to those who have already given us their names. We are hoping to start prayer walking on a Sunday morning during April and will contact directly those who have already volunteered to join a rota.



Restart of Evening Services:

Roger advised that the first service on 13th March was well attended and feedback was very positive. We will need help from a small "team" to enable these services to happen regularly. We need people to offer to be on "welcome duty", people to work the sound desk and pro-presenter and people to prepare a cup of tea/coffee after the service if people feel that would be helpful. Please see Roger if you can help.

Church meetings:

It was suggested that to avoid any confusion all church meetings (Members & prayer etc) should all have the same start time of 7.30pm. This was agreed by all present.

Communion:

With the relaxing of Covid restrictions it was suggested and agreed that the bread and wine would revert to being served to individuals during the service. (plates of bread and wine would still be available for anyone not comfortable with returning to this method)



News from the CAP front: Things seem to be settling to a steady tempo. I am seeing new clients and in April I will be taking my first client through their CAP budget. I am so proud of our existing clients who are paying regularly each month into their CAP plans and taking another step each month to going debt free.

I helped a client submit an online form for help with their water bill arrears and praise God the money has been awarded and that debt cleared.






